

Kanazawa City Evacuation Guidelines during Heavy Rain ~ Flooding Hazard Map ~

Estimated maximum scale

- "Evacuation Guidelines during Heavy Rain" provides information about flooding, evacuation, etc. for your safe evacuation when flooding has occurred or is expected to occur in your area. It is based on the Estimated Flooding Area Map that shows potential flooding areas caused by overflow of rivers due to heavy rain (provided by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism and Ishikawa Prefecture).
- Flooding areas and water depths are subject to change due to rainfall, land configuration change and river and sewerage conditions. In addition, since flooding due to the overflow of rivers, canals, sewerage, etc. is not estimated, flooding that is different from the map may occur. Please pay attention to information on the TV and radio.
- When there is a risk of flooding, directives such as the "Start of evacuation preparation/ Evacuation of elderly people", "Evacuation advisory", "Evacuation directive" etc. will be issued. Please evacuate immediately according to the instructions.

Evacuation Timing

Warning level 1 [Early advisory]

- Please pay attention to the latest information regarding disasters and weather.

Warning level 2 [Advisory]

- Please review your evacuation plan, using the hazard map, etc.

Warning level 3 [Evacuation of Elderly etc.]

- People who take time to evacuate, such as the elderly, must evacuate.
- Other people should be prepared for evacuation or evacuate on a voluntary basis.

Warning level 4 [Evacuation directive]

- The risk of disaster is extremely high. Please evacuate to an evacuation center immediately. However, if it is too dangerous to go out, seek refuge in a safe place inside.

Warning level 5 [Emergency Safety Assurance]

- A disaster has occurred. Please take the best action to protect your life.



If you feel in danger

Start to evacuate voluntarily even if no instruction has been issued yet.

Morimoto-gawa River	: 2-day total rainfall 919mm
Tsubatagawa River	: 2-day total rainfall 929mm
Unokegawa River	: 2-day total rainfall 938mm

- Areas where building destruction may occur due to riverbank erosion or river overflow

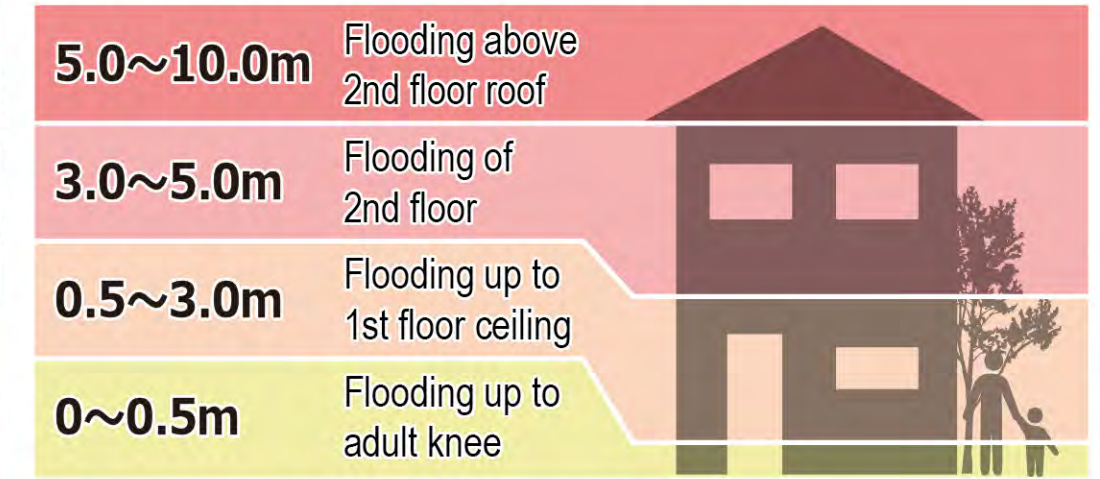
Note: The boundaries of school zones (areas) shown on the map are approximate.

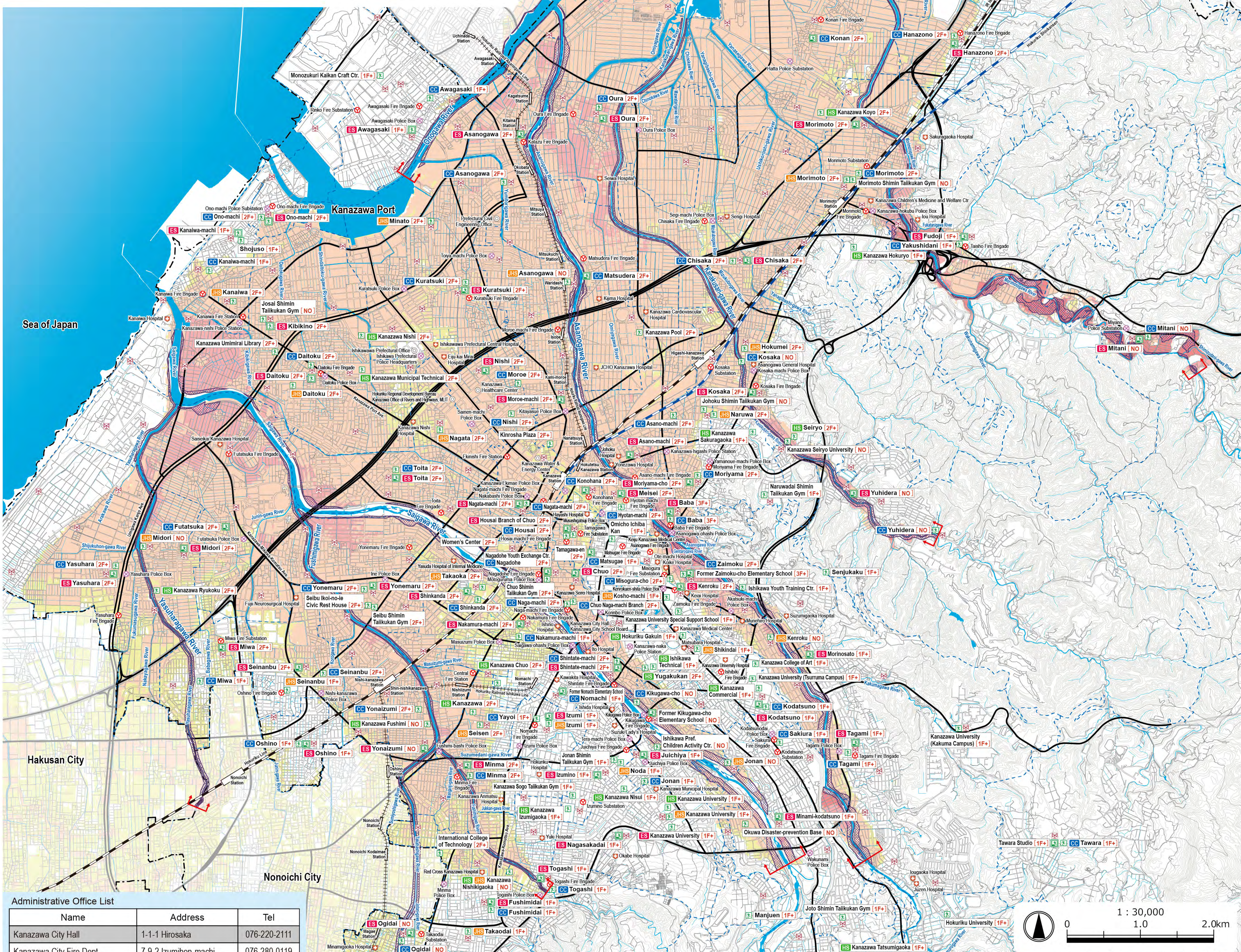
